From The Pastor's Desk

Then It Came To Me,...

Decently and in order." These words are part of I Corinthians 14:40. The entire verse is, "Let all things be done decently and in order." It was an admonition from the LORD through the Apostle Paul concerning maintaining order in worship assemblies. The Corinthian church needed guidelines that assured that "tongues, prophecies," nor any other permissible activities would be abused, thereby compromising the integrity of the worship experience. It seems Paul was saying that even good things needed to be managed.

Now, let us fast forward from Paul and the first century Christian church to Paul's word to us, the twenty-first century church. More particularly, let us seek the voice of the LORD from this verse to the summer situations of our children, families, and communities. Even now the LORD'S words to us are the same, "Let all things be done decently and in order."

Each summer, we hear of a variety of negative situations that involve someone's child or group of children being in an inappropriate place at an inappropriate time without appropriate supervision. Fathers, mothers, grandparents, and other guardians, you are responsible for your children's location and behavior twenty-four hours each day.

Summer school programs, summer camps, clubs, Vacation Bible School, and other resources may offer assistance. Still, parents and guardians must face and embrace responsibility for children. This includes what they do, where they go, how they behave, what they wear, and with whom they associate, among other things.

Freedoms must be given form and structure. In other words, destinations must be specific, time for each activity must be set, curfews must be set and enforced.

Besides giving form to their outside activities, parents must provide structure for the home scene. Children need chores appropriate for their abilities. Rewards are fine.

The formal name of this ministry is The Brotherhood of Bethesda Christian Fellowship. The dictionary definitions appropriate to our "brotherhood" are: 1) an association of men united in a common interest, work, creed, etc., as a fraternity or religious order; 2) a belief in or feeling of unity or cooperation among men or among all people.

In the spirit of 1st Peter 2:17, all Christians are a fraternity, united to Christ the head, alike disposed and gualified, related in the same interest, having communion one with another, going to the same home, and loving one another with an especial affection.

While all Bethesda members are a fraternity of believers, the membership in this ministry is comprised of male members 18 years old and above who faithfully support the Church through tithes, offerings, and attendance. The particulars of The Brotherhood organization and administration are set forth in the Brotherhood Directives. The Brotherhood's purpose is to support the church mission by enlisting and coordinating the Church's manpower to perform certain essential Christian activities, by promoting fellowship among men, and by cultivating the Christian life of laymen through study, worship, and service. The goals shall be dedicated to the welfare and wholeness of Bethesda and to the service of God. This ministry works out its purpose in various ways that even reinforce and complete the sense of unity and cooperation among the brothers for the sake of Christ. The ministry assists other ministries in the conduct of their essential Christian activities. The Brotherhood fosters fellowship among men at Father's/ Men's Day activities and throughout the year. It affords brothers the opportunity to share with, to strengthen, to encourage one another in a myriad of circumstances and conditions.

The Brotherhood facilitates the Wednesday Evening Academy, which is a strong

cultivator of Christian life for young boys through adult males.

Wholeness in our fellowship is exemplified by the Apostle Paul's instruction to the church at Corinth. 1st Corinthians 12:12-26 requires the effective functioning of all ministries of the church; therefore, The Brotherhood shares equal importance and responsibility with every other ministry to be on task in its functioning. This ministry's functioning, as it affects all members of the church, has immediate implications for unity of the body today and far reaching implications for that unity in the future. Cultivating the Christian life of laymen (through study) prepares and enables men to share the Gospel of Jesus Christ with the world. These cultivating activities serve to mature the fellowship. The Brotherhood's community service activities posits the bothers as "salt and light" in the community. As the Brotherhood facilitates Christian growth and maturity among men, the ministry flourishes in its ability to perpetually support the Church's mission and to undertake and complete tasks yet to be assigned through the Church's vision.

Scleroderma Awareness

What is Scleroderma?

Scleroderma, or systemic sclerosis, is a chronic connective tissue disease generally classified as one of the autoimmune rheumatic diseases.

The word "scleroderma" comes from two Greek words: "sclero" meaning hard, and "derma" meaning skin. Hardening of the skin is one of the most visible manifestations of the disease. The disease varies from patient-to-patient.

What Scleroderma is not:

Scleroderma is not contagious, infectious, cancerous or malignant.

How serious is Scleroderma?

The seriousness will depend on the parts of the body, which are affected, and the extent to which they are affected. A mild case can become more serious if not properly treated. Prompt and proper diagnosis and treatment by qualified physicians may minimize the symptoms of scleroderma.

How is Scleroderma diagnosed?

The diagnostic process may require consultation with rheumatologists (arthritis specialists), and/or dermatologists (skin specialists) and require blood studies and numerous other specialized tests depending upon which organs are affected.

What causes Scleroderma?

The exact cause or causes of scleroderma are still unknown, but scientists and medical researchers are working hard to make those determinations. It is known that scleroderma involves an overproduction of collagen.

What is the treatment for Scleroderma? Currently, there is no cure for scleroderma, but there are many treatments available to help particular symptoms.

Fast Facts:

•Approximately 300,000 Americans have scleroderma

•Approximately three to four times more women develop scleroderma

 Scleroderma can affect every age group, but the onset is most frequent between 25 and 55

 Lung disease is a major cause of scleroderma-related deaths.

What is our responsibility to our children. our youth?

- Through some organization or recreational program, such as TMCA, Boys and Girls Club, etc., find some productive recreation for your children.
- Remember, the Lord blessed us with children, and it's our responsibility to rear them; we must not allow them to rear themselves.

Rearing consists of more than providing food and shelter. It includes providing a nurturing, loving home environment, where emotional needs are met. This environment should also include structure in the children's lives.

Their routine should include specific times to eat, to do homework, to talk on the phone, to do chores, to go to bed, as well as family time.

The Bible admonishes us in *Proverb* 22:6

to train up our children in the way they ought to go, and when they are old, they will not depart from it. We must bring them up in the nurture and admonition of the Lord.

Parents and community we, indeed have a tremendous job, ahead of us, but remember that we have an advocate-with God all things are possible. I know that all of our children are not "hangin` and getting into trouble," but those who are out of control impede the progress of others and reflect badly on us as a race.

Let's no longer look the other way and look for someone else to solve our problems. Let's instead, put our shoulders to the "grind" and make a difference.

6.) The applicant must have at least one (1) year membership tenure.

7.) The applicant must have at least a 3.0 GPA and be in the top 20 percent of his/her graduating class.

8.) The applicant must submit a narrative detailing future plans and degree pursuits. The narrative must describe how the applicant's degree will affect others and how it will affect their walk with the Lord.
